

General Disaster Rules	
The Disaster	General Rules to Follow
Tornado	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Move residents to any area with four walls and no windows, such as:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Hallways</li> <li>* Bathrooms</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Stay away from windows.</li> <li>• Use pillows for protection from flying objects.</li> <li>• Close resident room doors as well as fire and safety doors.</li> <li>• Pull drapes across windows.</li> </ul>
Hurricane	<p>You may be required to evacuate the residence.</p> <p>If so, help residents pack <b>essential</b> items, such as medications.</p> <p>(If evacuation is not required, follow the rules for tornadoes.)</p>
Flood	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Remove residents from below ground or ground floor rooms.</li> <li>• Keep residents sheltered in above ground rooms.</li> <li>• Keep residents away from windows and doors.</li> </ul>
Heavy Snow or Blizzard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Do not let residents go outside until the snow has been shoveled.</li> <li>• Ensure proper clothing such as boots, hats, and gloves.</li> <li>• Limit the time that a resident is outside.</li> </ul>
Earthquake	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Help residents to doorways or onto the floor. Bring blankets and pillows for protection and comfort.</li> <li>• Know the location and contents of the earthquake emergency box which contains flashlights, batteries, a portable radio, and first-aid supplies.</li> </ul>
Power Outage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Know where the flashlights are.</li> <li>• Move residents into a common area such as a dining room or activities room.</li> </ul>
